Dear Friend,

On February 18 the church will observe Ash Wednesday with a service of worship in the sanctuary. Ash Wednesday begins the 40 day period leading up to Easter called Lent. Christians across the years have used these 40 days to examine how their relationship with God is going. Some questions worth considering this Lent are:

"How am I distracted from loving God and loving my neighbor?"

"Are there habits or patterns of behavior that have taken over too much of my life?"

"What do I need to let go of in my life so I can more faithfully share the life of Christ in my relationships at home, work, or in school?"

Many try various spiritual practices to remove distractions from their lives and to intentionally draw closer to God. Upper Room Ministries offers great resources to learn more about the meaning of Lent with suggestions for trying some spiritual practices yourself these 40 days. You can find that information here:



Reflections of Grace by The Rev. David Blauw

I'm writing to have you consider, at your discretion, including my reflections in the service tomorrow.

Grace was aptly named....and was, as was our Lord, "full of GRACE and truth." Her demeanor of gentle strength, mature wisdom and spiritual depth was a great influence on my life as a young pastor. Her intentional, behind the scenes, and in front of the camera leadership was an influence of faith in action and an inward model for me personally as well as countless others. Her love of her family, and my family, was always evident and her commitment to Blawenburg Church "unrelenting". I treasure Grace's influence in my life since 1982. She was, and is, a gift to so many, from the gracious hand of God.

In addition, here is the text of her note of "farewell" when I left the pastorate of Blawenburg Church in June of 1994. I now think these very words in reference to her death.

"How do you say goodbye to someone who touched your life in ways too numerous to count? How do you say goodbye? Our prayers together mean so much. How can we be out of touch. Kindness and understanding were always there, a friend in need in our despair. How can we say goodbye?

But then God's voice came when I was abed, "You don't have to say goodbye," he said. "You'll always have treasured memories of friendship, of love, of laughter and tears. Carry these with you wherever you go." No goodby, just "God Bless You!"


