There's a Baby on the Way!



Farewell to Nancy Curtis

On Sunday, May 10th – Mothers Day – Nancy Curtis was in the pulpit...not an unfamiliar place for her, but definitely a bittersweet moment. Nancy had preached more than once, but this would be her final appearance before heading off as a *chaplain-in-training* at Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital in New Brunswick.

"I've been a part of Blawenburg Church since I was two," Nancy said. "And the church is certainly part of me. I'll miss it here, but I'm grateful for what I've learned." Since 1998, Nancy Curtis has in many ways been the face of the church, starting as a bookkeeper, then church secretary, and for the last several years the church's admin-

istrator. Along the way, Nancy was trained in **Stephen Ministry**, a counseling program designed to help people in crisis through *intentional listening*.

Nancy grew up in Montgomery, in the house on Sunset Road where her mom, Bernice Van-Nostrand, still lives. She went through the Montgomery school system and had her mother as a social studies teacher in 5th and And she survived 6th grades. her dad's brief stint in politics. Mait VanNostrand served as mayor in the early 70s, ending his tenure in 1976 - the year of the U.S. Bicentennial celebration. VanNostrand is perhaps best remembered as having hired the township's first police officers. Mait passed away in March.

In a memorable Blawenburg Church moment, Nancy took to the pulpit in 2011 and in a hypothetical **conversation with God** (played by dad Mait in the balcony), delivered a sermon worthy of an ordained pastor.

"Blawenburg Church has a history of producing faith leaders," said the church's minister, Rev. Travis Winckler. "I have a feeling we'll be hearing from Nancy again. Farewell, Nancy Curtis. We'll miss you, but we know you'll do good work. Your mom is very proud, as we all are. And we're sure your dad is as well."



The Body of Christ

Your Worship Team would love for the congregation to sit forward and together in the center section in church during Sunday worship... whenever possible. Until our sound system is upgraded, we understand that some people can hear better under either balcony nearer that one working speaker and will need to sit there still. But for the majority of us, sitting closer would help us worship more meaningfully for several reasons:



- I. Theologically, we are the 'body of Christ'. We can sense the strength and unity of that body when we are gathered together more closely physically. Let's show visitors that we are a body!
- 2. We sing more confidently when we are surrounded by other voices in unison. Singing is a major way we participate in worship and can serve as a tremendously meaningful ministry to ourselves, to others in the congregation, to visitors and to seekers. Being close also helps us acoustically!
- 3. We are able to 'pass the peace of Christ' to those around us as a unified body with less disruption to the flow of the service, leaving our fellowship time to coffee hour.

Hymnals

We know there is confusion and some frustration when we use two navy blue hymnals! However there are times when the most appropriate hymn happens to be in Rejoice in the Lord [RITL], our former hymnal. Neither hymnal has all that we want to use for the most meaningful worship experience. For now, we will continue our recent practice of providing the RITLs at the entry and ask that you pick up a copy on your way in if you see "RITL" up on the Hymn announcement board. If you would prefer to have the hymn printed as an insert, please let Travis, Gracie, or Katie know.


