

# **Consistory Minutes Highlights**

March 2025

## **Ongoing and Special Business**

### Discussion About Short-Term Pastoral Services

- Classis Consultant, Beth Scibienski, informed Consistory that she will provide a Part-Time Transitional/Interim Pastor job description.
- Consistory indicated that they would like to interview Rev. Marisol Ferrer Malloy who is interested in the Transitional Pastor position, and has submitted a resumé.
- A team was formed to refine the job description that Beth will provide and begin the process of sending it out. They will also pursue the possibility of interviewing Rev. Ferrer Malloy. The team members include Sam Prince, Gina Williams, Mark Smith, Sonya Hunt.

## **New Business**

- Rahma Center's Impact on BVS – BVS Director Angela Wright will be asked to attend the April Consistory meeting to give her opinion on how the Rahma Center impacts the school, and voice any concerns that she might have.

## **VP Report**

- Consistory Nominations – Mark informed Consistory that he is completing his second two-year term. He also suggested that four individuals are completing their first two-year term and need to decide if they are staying on for a second term. Those individuals are Sam Prince, Barbara Van Liew, Gina Williams, and Sonya Hunt (who filled an unexpired term.) Mark will begin the process of forming a nominating team.

## **Team Reports**

### Finance

- The team recommended that the 5% that we withdrew from the Pfannebecker Fund in January (approximately \$4700) be earmarked for the Cemetery Team. Consistory unanimously gave its approval.

### Properties

- The team reported that Geno Keller will be donating an almost-new hot water heater that he will install at BVS.
- All Wildlife Removal Services has inspected the church for bats and will be submitting a report.

## Missions

- The team requested that Consistory give its blessing to two upcoming community events: *Run with Rotary* on April 27 which would necessitate having worship on Sunday evening on that date, and *Bikes for the World* on May 10 which would necessitate the use of the church driveway and facilities in Cook Hall. Consistory gave its blessing to both events.
